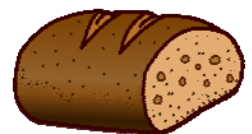

I hope everyone survived the cold weather without too many frozen pipes. I know just about everyone is breathing a sigh of relief that the weather warmed up just a bit.

A few things to remember; On February 13 the INNEC Board of Directors will be meeting at the Nondalton Community Center. The main focus of discussion will be a rate increase scheduled to be implemented on June 1, 2017. The reason for the increase is to be able to pay for underground power line replacement.

We will also be discussing the ongoing project to upgrade the Tazimina Hydro Electric Plant. This meeting is open to all INNEC members.

Here is some electricity trivia:

Iceland is the only country in the world whose electricity supply comes entirely from renewable resources.

Electricity travels at the speed of light-more than 186,000 mile per second. (That's pretty quick!!)
