Chef John's Fresh Salmon Cakes

- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/4 cup minced onion
- 2 tablespoons minced red bell pepper
- 2 tablespoons mined celery
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tablespoon capers
- 1 1/4 pounds fresh wild salmon, coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup panko bread crumbs
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 pinch cayenne pepper
- 1 pinch seafood seasoning (such as Old Bay®)
- 1 tablespoon panko bread crumbs, or to taste
- 2 tablespoons olive oil, or as needed
- 1) Heat extra virgin olive oil in a skillet over medium heat. Cook and stir onion, red pepper, celery, and a pinch of salt in hot oil until onion is soft and translucent, about 5 minutes. Add capers; cook and stir until fragrant, about 2 minutes. Remove from heat and cool to room temperature.
- 2) Stir salmon, onion mixture, mayonnaise, 1/4 cup bread crumbs, garlic, mustard, cayenne, seafood seasoning, salt, and ground black pepper together in a bowl until well-mixed. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and refrigerate until firmed and chilled, 1 to 2 hours.
- 3) Form salmon mixture into four 1-inch thick patties; sprinkle remaining panko bread crumbs over each patty.
- 4) Heat olive oil in a skillet over medium-heat. Cook patties in hot oil until golden and cooked through, 3 to 4 minutes per side.

MANAGERS REPORT

Happy July everybody!

We had a nice surprise last week when the RCA (Regulatory Commission of Alaska) announced the new PCE (Power Cost Equalization) rate for IN-NEC. Our old rate was .2763 per kWh. Our new rate is .3560 per kWh. This is about 7.5 cents more per kWh than we were getting before.

PCE is a State subsidy for rural Alaska that pays a portion of your residential electricity bill up to 500 kWh per month. With our new PCE rate this means for a household that uses 500 kWh per month you will be seeing an additional \$40.35 savings on your monthly bill.

If you have an AMPY pre-pay meter you should have had someone come to your house to swipe a penny card. This will reprogram your meter for the new PCE rate. If you have not had your meter re-programmed, please call our office right away. Consumers that do not have the pre-pay meters will see the new rate on the July statement when it is mailed out.

We are very fortunate to have Terri Earl as our financial Manager. Terri was the manager of the PCE program for Alaska Energy Authority for several years. She knows the program and how it runs and she does a great job of ensuring that we are able to derive maximum benefit from the PCE program.

Terri is the one that goes to the RCA and requests that they look at our PCE rate to be sure it is correct. Exactly a year ago Terri was able to secure a larger PCE rate for us and now she has done so again!!

If you see Terri when she is out here please be sure to thank her for her hard work on our behalf.
